What? (Key Knowledge)

Mecca	Is in Saudia Arabia and is the birthplace of the prophet Muhammed (pbuh). It is home to the Kaaba , which is the cube shaped building at the centre of the Grand Mosque .
Why do Muslims pray in a mosque?	Muslims believe that praying together in groups brings greater blessings than praying alone. The prophet Muhammad said, 'Prayer at home is counted once, prayer at the local mosque is equivalent to twenty-five prayers.'
Hajj	An annual Islamic pilgrimage to Mecca, which is the holiest city for Muslims. Muslims wear special hajj robes .
Wudu	A washing routine conducted before Islamic prayers: Wash hands three times Wash mouth three times Wash nose, face and arms three times Wet head and wash feet

Possible experiences

- Visit to a local mosque - Al-Emaan mosque in Keston.
- Outdoor Learning – Take a bowl of water outside and conduct wudu.

Mosque	The Islamic place of worship.

Mihrab	An alcove that shows the direction of Mecca.
Minbar	A place in the mosque where the prayer leader stands.
Musalla	An open space used for prayer outside a mosque.
