


Science		<p><u>Lesson 2- WALT: be able to identify and compare the suitability of a variety of everyday materials, including wood, metal, plastic, glass, brick, rock, paper and cardboard for particular uses.</u></p> <p>You need to conduct and experiment to find the best materials for the most waterproof school shoes. Try and find some materials or objects made of different materials that you can test.</p> <p>Record the materials used and give them a score of 0-5 according to how waterproof they were. 5 being the most waterproof.</p> <p>Once you have completed your experiment write a conclusion of what you found out.</p>
History/ Geography	PowerPoint presentation -	<p><u>Lesson 1: WALT: To find out about events beyond living memory that are significant nationally by learning about Guy Fawkes and his life. Consider the actions of the historical figure 'Guy Fawkes'</u></p> <p>Work through the PowerPoint and as you do write down key facts about the gunpowder plot.</p> <p>Discuss the gunpowder plot with an adult in your house.</p>

Art/ D &T	Range of different coloured fruits Drawing pencils Paints Chalk pastels	<p><u>Lesson 2 – Objective - Use tints and shades to paint a simple still life of a piece of fruit (can be whole or cut in to pieces).</u></p> <p>Collect a range of fruits from your house. Ask an adult to cut open some of the fruits and explore the different colours inside fruit (kiwi, watermelon, apple, blueberry) discuss colours found and various tones.</p> <p>Complete an observational drawing of the fruit and add tonal colour using pencils, crayons or watercolours.</p>
