# What Happens on November 5<sup>th</sup>?


On 5<sup>th</sup> November each year, people in the United Kingdom often watch firework displays and light bonfires.

It is the year 1605 in London. A group of young Catholic men meet to talk about their worries and how angry they are that King James I is punishing Catholic people in England.






London in 1605

## The Start of the Gunpowder Plot


The men often meet in secret in London. They know that the King opens Parliament every year and that the King will be here in November 1605. They decide to blow up the houses of parliament when the king is inside! They are going to use many barrels of gunpowder to do this.

# A Problem for the Plotters



The men have a problem. How are they going to get the gunpowder into the Houses of Parliament?

What do you think they should do? What are they saying to each other?

# What Happened Next?

Thomas Percy, who is a royal bodyguard, moves to a house not far from Parliament.

The men start digging a tunnel from the house underneath the Houses of Parliament. They dig at night to avoid anyone hearing them.

Then — a stroke of luck! Thomas Percy is allowed to rent a space in a cellar directly underneath the Houses of Parliament, right under where the King would be sitting!


They don't need to dig a tunnel anymore.

Guy Fawkes pretends to be Percy's servant and starts moving barrels of gunpowder into the cellar and hides them.

Altogether he puts 36 barrels in the cellar.


# What Happened Next?

Then, just days before they are ready to blow up Parliament, the plotters discover another problem! On 26<sup>th</sup> October 1605, Lord Monteagle, who is a Catholic, receives an unsigned letter that warns him not to go to the opening of Parliament on the 5<sup>th</sup> November. This is what part of it says:



"My Lord, out of the love I bear to some of your friends, I have a care of your preservation, therefore I would advise you as you tender your life to devise some excuse to shift your attendance at this parliament... I say they shall receive a terrible blow this parliament and yet they shall not see who hurts them..."

# The Plotters Role Play



A servant of Lord Monteagle tells the plotters that someone has written a letter about their plans to blow up parliament.

# What Happened Next?

The plotters worried that they could not go ahead with their plan. They wanted to find out who sent the letter but had no proof about who wrote it.

They checked to see whether the cellar had been searched and the gunpowder was still there. They decided to carry on with their plan to blow up Parliament...
