<b>What? (Key Knowledge)</b>	
<b>Brahman as the Supreme God and his deity</b>	Brahman has different deities with different roles and responsibilities.
<b>The tri-murti</b>	Brahman is the supreme God and has different aspects through the tri-murti: Brahma - creator (He created the entire universe, including himself. He began by creating water and dropping a seed into the ocean.). Vishnu - preserver (His role is to return to the Earth in troubled times and restore the balance of good and evil. So far, he has been incarnated nine times, but Hindus believe that he will be reincarnated one last time close to the end of this world). Shiva - destroyer (destroys the universe in order to recreate it).
<b>Brahman being present in everything</b>	Brahman can be seen and celebrated through different mediums - e.g. dance/poetry
<b>Brahman and the three deities (Tri-murti)</b>	Brahman is the supreme being who can be everywhere and in everything through the tri-murti.

(e.g. the sea can represent Brahma, a storm - Shiva etc)</li> </ul>
