### Frequently Asked Questions

#### • Why has my child been chosen?

Children are referred by either their teacher, members of the PIT Stop Team or their parents/carers. Children can be referred for a variety of reasons including:

- Requiring a confidence boost
- Support with friendships
- Bereavement

We also have a drop-in service where children can self-refer and request their own appointment.

#### How long will the sessions last?

This depends on which service in PIT Stop your child is accessing. Time2Talk and other low-level drop-ins last approximately 10/15 minutes. Small group interventions last approximately 20 minutes and 1:1 therapeutic services can last up to 60 minutes per week.



### Frequently Asked Questions

 Will my child miss any of their key subjects whilst attending their session?

We work closely with your child's teacher to ensure that key learning within the curriculum isn't missed and/or they are provided with opportunities to catch-up with additional adult support in the classroom..
