At the end of last term, we asked for feedback for on all elements of school life. We are very grateful for those who took the time to complete these questionnaires. And for the fantastic feedback regarding the increased provision for enrichment activities linked to the £1 club. This will be continuing this year and hope to share information about this shortly.

One of the key pieces of feedback was about the reduction in school trips since Covid; there was an increase in these last year but we acknowledge we can do better!

This year therefore, teachers have been asked to plan a trip, visit, experience or excusion at least once per term. Wherever possible, we will be utilising public transport to keep costs low.

## **Music at Midfield**

This term we are thrilled to be welcoming new Music Teachers to Midfield Primary School. As a result of a collaboration between ourselves and the Bexley Music Hub - children in KS2 will be accessing a bespoke high quality Music Curriculum delivered by specialists.

Fear not parents of our younger pupils, our Early Years and KS1 Teams have received training in delivering a new music programme called Charanga and will be following the new Model Music Plan created by specialists in the Department for Education.

In addition to our curriculum music offer, last term, we wrote to parents inviting them to express interest about their child learning an instrument in small groups. We are delighted to share that these have been arranged, lessons will be starting next week and Mrs Eede is contacting families individually to discuss payment methods for the term.

These small group instrumental lessons are now oversubscribed but we are working on increasing capacity. If you didn't get back to us before the summer, don't worry - we are opening a waiting list from Monday. Please let Mrs Eede know if you'd like to join a waiting list for a particular instrument.

### Free School Meal Applications



#### Mayor of London Funding for School Meals

This week saw the launch of the Mayor of London's funding scheme for all children in London Primary Schools to have a free school meal. This is part of a 1 year project to support London families with the cost of living crisis. Many children at Midfield this week have taken advantage of this and today we served approximately 100 meals more than usual! This is of course wonderful, but naturally it is taking a little bit longer to get through kitchen service and so as such, we have adjusted our lunch times so that lunch is now done in two different sittings.

### Did you know that school funding is linked to eligible free school meal families?

Whilst being able to provide free school meals is fantastic, it's really important that those who are eligible for means-tested free school meals still apply. Not only does this affect our school budgets and staffing, but it also means that after the Mayoral offer concludes next summer, your child will continue to receive free school meals for the remainder of their time with us.

#### **RAAC Concrete Updates**

We wrote to you last week regarding the highly publicised RAAC issue facing many schools at the moment. We continue to work with the DfE and will keep you updated if anything changes and/or we hear anything that might affect Midfield

#### Play / Animal Therapy at Midfield

Nina Balachander is a Therapeutic Play Practitioner who works with children (and their families) to overcome difficult emotional or psychological situations that is preventing a child to reach their full potential.

Nina Balachander's role includes promoting children's emotional health and well-being, and running specific interventions such as play and creative arts therapy. She also works alongside her Therapy dog Skye, to provide weekly support to those children that need it.

Skye joined Midfield Primary over a year ago. She has brought significant benefits, educationally and emotionally, to children she has worked with. Research has shown many advantages to therapy and reading dogs in school.

#### The benefits of a school dog

School dogs have been proven to help develop pupils' reading skills, improve behaviour, attendance and academic confidence, as well as increasing student understanding of responsibility and in the development of empathy and nurturing skills.

#### Animal assisted interventions can:

- Teach empathy and appropriate interpersonal skills
- Help individuals develop social skills
- Be soothing/calming
- Improve a child's ability to pick up on social cues which are imperative to human relationships
- Therapy dogs have been shown to support emotional regulation through the positive impact on the autonomic nervous system
- Show that children working with therapy dogs have experienced increased improved motivation for learning, resulting in improved outcomes
- Therapy dogs are being used to support children with their social and emotional learning needs, which can also aid literacy development.






#### **Polite Notices**

#### Attendance

We continue to strive towards excellence and the only way we can do that is if your children are in school. We recognise that on rare occasions they may be poorly, but when this is the case - you must contact the school everyday they are absent. Failure to do so may result in a home-visit from school or the Education Welfare Officer. It's far more straight forward if you just call and let us know the reason for the absence and/or provide us with an update each day they're poorly. Our Attendance target this year is 96% which takes into consideration usual childhood illnesses.
